## Secret Sock Society's ski trips to Cannon Mountain a big hit with youngsters

FRANCONIA — A 2015 North Face Explore Fund Grant enabled fifth graders from Whitefield, Jefferson and Littleton to experience snowboarding or skiing for the first time.

On March 15, the Secret Sock Society hosted students from Whitefield and Jefferson. The following day students from Lakeway Elementary had their turn to hit the slopes.

Over two days, 82 local students participated in the field trip along with ten school volunteers and 11 Secret Sock Society volunteers. Nearly half of those students were trying a snow sport for the first time.

Chaperones recorded quotes from the kids throughout the day.

Comments included, "This is the best day ever," "I'm a pro my first time," "Skiing is Awesome," and, "This is the best thing that has ever happened to me!"

When the students were asked if the program should continue next year they said, "Yes, because it gives kids a chance to get out. Please do it again." "Yes it's fun, all kids should have fun." "Yes, to give kids a chance to try something new." Lastly, "Yes, cause it is a chance to try something different and it was fun."


Annunziato said, "I would like to thank the Lahout family, who has been very generous in their support of the Secret Sock Society programs."
